School Context

Campbell Primary School prides itself on being a learning community, comprised of students, parents, teachers and community representatives. Our vision is to help children reach their educational potential. Each student at our school should have an increased growth in literacy and numeracy performance during their time here. To achieve this we identified two priority areas that we must focus on in the next four years. The setting of priorities was informed by recommendations of an external validation panel in 2014, findings based on staff feedback using the National School improvement and Safe School tools, ACT Training and Education Directorate plans, and comprehensive stakeholder feedback, obtained from satisfaction surveys, focus groups and self-evaluation assessments.

Strategic Priority 1: Develop consistent and effective school wide approaches to teaching and learning

Desired Outcome

- Increasing growth in students' performance in Literacy and Numeracy over time
- Alignment of curriculum, pedagogy, assessment and reporting
- A whole school systematic approach to intervention and enrichment that responds to the learning needs of all students.
- Teachers understand and confidently use data to inform pedagogy and differentiate learning outcomes.

Performance Measures

- The proportion of 'within school' matched students achieving expected growth in NAPLAN in all domains
- The proportion of students who achieve expected growth and above in PIPs reading and numeracy based on a four year average
- Proportion of within school matched students achieving at the proficiency standards in year 5.

Key Improvement Strategies

- Embed a culture of analysis and discussion of data to inform teaching
- Implement coaching and mentoring regimes to improve teaching practice
- Embed a Campbell Primary curriculum and pedagogical framework based on ELYF and AC
